

“Broken But Building: How God Uses Us for Eternal Things”

Exodus 35:1-40:33

Life-Shaping Principle . . .

Even in our brokenness, God invites us to build a home for His presence.

Graces that Build God’s Dwelling . . .

- God restores our **hearts** for His **worship**.

- God equips our **hands** for His **work**.

- God forms a **people** for His **presence**.

Reflect then Act . . .

- **Reflect:** When God invites you to join His work, what holds you back most: the guilt that says you’re disqualified, the fear that what you offer won’t matter, or something else?
- **Act:** This week, build up Christ’s Church by encouraging one fellow believer with God’s Word—a conversation, text, prayer, or handwritten note that points them to His faithfulness.

Pray for Someone After the Service

This November, we’re taking a few intentional steps to grow as a church that prays for one another. After the service today, take a few minutes to start a conversation, listen well, and pray together.

This Week’s Prayer Prompt

Ask: “*How can I pray for you?*”

Response: “I’ve been really stressed at work lately.”

Transition: “Thanks for sharing that. Would it be okay if I prayed for that right now?”

Prayer: “Father, You care about every part of our lives. Please give peace and strength in their work this week. Help them trust You and represent You well. Amen.”

We’re **not aiming for perfection, but for participation**. Every Christian is called to be a **prayerful proclaimer of God’s Word**—to speak and pray truth into the lives of others. This is one small step toward becoming that kind of people.
